

Collaborating with international agencies such as UNESCO, UN Women, Inter-American Development Bank, Smithsonian Center for Folklife & Cultural Heritage, and the Organisation of American States, Washington DC; Ministry of Planning and Sustainability and Ministry of Culture, Youth and Community Development Trinidad & Tobago, National Art Gallery of Jamaica, National Art Gallery of the Bahamas, National Museum of Trinidad & Tobago and University of the West Indies, Rutgers University, American University, University of Haiti (IERAH) and numerous non-profits across the region and beyond.







What's on in the Arts!

TOn Sunday, December 15, 2024, the National Gallery of Jamaica proudly unveils the highly anticipated Kingston Biennial 2024: Green X Gold exhibition. Hosted at 12 Ocean Boulevard, the official opening ceremony will commence at 1:30 PM.

This year's Biennial, Green X Gold, delves into themes of land, environment, and ecology, drawing profound inspiration from the symbolic colors of the Jamaican flag. The exhibition challenges the idyllic "paradise" narrative often portrayed in Caribbean tourism marketing, juxtaposing it with the urgent and less-visible ecological realities facing Jamaica and the region.

The event is free and open to all, offering an inclusive opportunity for visitors to engage with thought-provoking art in a transformative museum setting. Doors open from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM, inviting the public to immerse themselves in this powerful exploration of culture, identity, and the environment



DR. VEERLE POUPEYE, DIRECTOR, CAYMAN ISLANDS NATIONAL MUSEUM

The Cayman Islands National Museum has announced its new Director and it is non other than Dr. Veerle Poupeye.

Dr. Veerle Poupeye is a distinguished art historian, writer, and curator with a deep connection to Caribbean art and culture. Born in Belgium, she has lived in Jamaica since the 1980s and has become a leading authority on Jamaican and Caribbean art. Dr. Poupeye served as the Executive Director of the National Gallery of Jamaica and played a pivotal role in shaping its programming and scholarship. She is the author of Caribbean Art, a foundational text that explores the region's rich artistic heritage, and has contributed extensively to critical discourse on contemporary Caribbean art. Known for her rigorous scholarship and advocacy for the arts, Dr. Poupeye has been instrumental in promoting Caribbean visual culture on a global stage.

ART BASEL

LAVAR MUNROE will exhibet at ARt Basel alonside other noted Caribbean artists. His work "City of Gold" is dedicated to his grandmother. He says of the work:

"City of Gold" (2024)

"This piece, spanning 13 feet, was made as a dedication to my grandmother, Cynthia Rebecca Hannah, who passed away just over a month ago. I began working on it four months ago, after learning of her terminal illness, and finished it a week after her passing.

In many ways, I view this work as a posthumous collaboration with my grandmothers—both now deceased. The characters in the piece are adorned with earrings from my maternal grandmother, Sadie Curtis, who predeceased my father's mother, Cynthia Rebecca Hannah. These symbols carry so much meaning to me: a bridge between generations, a way of honoring their lives and legacies.

"City of Gold" represents a celebration, a conversation, and a meeting of souls—a continuation of love, memories, and presence beyond the physical realm.

May they both rest in eternal power."
